

Park Lane Community Council Meeting Minutes

May 18, 2017

Park Lane Conference Room – 7:00 p.m.

- I. Council reviewed the minutes from the previous meeting.
 - a. Shelby Rodgers motioned to approve the minutes, Michelle Pearce seconded the motion.
 - b. The council voted unanimously to approve the minutes.
- II. SNAP Plan updates
 - a. Parking Lot is on the district's 5-year plan to be redone. The slope is too steep and will be improved.
 - b. Concerns had been expressed that the walk on the south side to the sidewalk is also steep. It will be fixed when the parking lot is redone.
 - c. Other concerns for Sandy City
 - i. Sandy City is in the beginning process of adding sidewalks on 10000 S above Park Lane as the road leads to Granite Park.
 - ii. The question was raised by the council earlier this year as to why there are no flashing lights reminded people of the school zone east of the 4-way stop on 10000 S. The city informed us that the 4-way stop eliminates the need for these lights.
- III. Parent and Student Handbook
 - a. The council discussed proper footwear and how to encourage such to keep students safe both on the playground and in the building. An informal suggestion was made to students to wear close-toed shoes instead of flip flops to school to reduce the risk of injury on the playground and during P.E.
 - i. The council further discussed outdoor cleats and proposed to include language discouraging outdoor cleats inside the Park Lane building.
 - ii. Mr. Jeffrey reiterated that elementary school is the time to teach students appropriate dress for school.
 1. The district dress code will be included in this Parent/Student Handbook
- IV. Stipend Approvals
 - a. It was proposed that \$500 be given to the faculty member who maintains the Park Lane Elementary website.
 - i. Linda Tognoni moved to vote in the affirmative, Jen Coccimiglio seconded the motion.
 - ii. The council voted unanimously to allocate \$500 towards website maintenance.
 - b. It was further proposed that the Art teacher be compensated \$100 for his or her time spent in preparation for Park Lane's annual Night of the Arts.
 - i. Linda Tognoni moved to vote in the affirmative, Shelby Rodgers seconded the motion.

ii. The council voted unanimously to allocate \$100 towards this stipend.

V. Miscellaneous Business

a. Staffing issues for 2017-2018 school year

i. Laura Taylor, the Beverly Taylor Sorenson drama teacher will be leaving at the end of this school year.

ii. The 3rd grade teacher originally offered a position at Park Lane changed her mind. A new teacher has already been offered and has accepted the position to replace her.
