A. Park Lane SCC Organization

- a. Welcome & Introductions
- b. Approve Roster, verify contact information
- c. Elections of chair, vice chair, and note-taker
 - i. Chair: Jake Prestwich nominated by Jen Coccimiglio, second by Shelby Rogers. Voting was unanimous in the affirmative.
 - ii. Vice-chair: Bekah Gardner nominated by Jake Prestwich, second by Shelby Rogers. Voting was unanimous in the affirmative.
 - iii. Note-taker: Jen Coccimiglio nominated by Jake Prestwich, second by Linda Tognoni. Voting was unanimous in the affirmative.
- d. Future meeting dates.
 - i. Meetings will be held the third Thursday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Park Lane Conference Room as needed.
 - ii. Meetings will be advertised in advance to the Park Lane community.
- e. To inform parents without internet access, the council will post meeting dates on the bulletin board across from the Main Office. Proposed agendas will also be posted.

B. Park Lane Data & Information

- a. Review of School CSIP & Land Trust Plan
 - i. The Land Trust Plan for the 2016-2017 school year will be made available for public access on the school's website.
- b. SAGE Data and PACE Report
 - i. Park Lane has earned an A grade for the second year in a row.
 - ii. A complete breakdown of Park Lane's scores can be found on the Canyon's District website by selecting Schools then Park Lane.
- c. Fundraiser Report
 - i. Each year, the school or SCC is allowed to hold a fundraiser, and the PTA is allowed to hold an additional fundraiser. It is not anticipated that the school or SCC will need to hold a fundraiser each year.
 - ii. This year's candy bar fundraiser was a big success. Park Lane earned roughly \$12,000.

- 1. The money will go towards the procurement of technology, especially Chrome books for 4th and 5th grades
- 2. This will allow all 4th and 5th grade access to Chrome books when needed.

C. Initial SCC Needs Assessment

- a. Update on Teacher requests. Many preferences have been initiated or are completed, including digital clocks, electronic sharpeners, benches, ice machine, increased technology for classrooms.
- b. Continued efforts toward school beautification are being considered.

D. Budget

- a. Review of Current Land Trust Budget
- b. Proposed Cell Tower Budget:
 - i. Budget Status
 - 1. There is a current balance of \$28,954.
 - ii. Other needs that could be addressed from this budget.
 - 1. Currently, the AM Kindergarten class is the largest in the school. The Council discussed concerns and the option of hiring an aide to be in the class on a daily basis.
 - a. The cost for this aide would be approximately \$5,000.
 - b. The council voted unanimously to allocate \$5,000 towards this.
 - 2. Mr. Jeffrey requested an additional \$4,086 for the procurement of Chrome books that would be used in 3rd grade classes. With these, all students grades 3-5 will have access to Chrome books as needed for Utah Compose, Lexia, Reflex Math, testing, and keyboarding practice.
 - a. The council voted unanimously to allocate \$4,086 of the Cell Tower budget towards this.
 - 3. The council further approved, unanimously, \$2,000 towards teacher incentives and \$500 towards campus beautification efforts, including flower pots and other décor.
 - 4. The council would like to add a banner or artwork to the east gym wall. No decision was made at this time.

E. District Information

- a. Internet Safety
 - i. Canyons School District has extensive filters to prevent access to inappropriate material.
 - ii. Elementary school students have fewer privileges than middle and high school students.
 - iii. Last year, the filter was extended to include Yahoo other search engines other than Google Safe Search.
 - 1. This change was made in response to an instance last year at Park Lane where a student accessed inappropriate material.

- 2. The school has also added additional procedures to ensure proper usage of technology, including having the screens face the teacher so he/she can view activity at all times.
- b. Bell Schedule Survey (PPT)
 - i. A proposed Bell Schedule change was presented to the council to address busing issues.
 - ii. Two options are currently under consideration at the district level.
 - 1. Option One would postpone the start and end time for Park Lane by 15 minutes.
 - 2. Option Two would postpone the start and end time for Park Lane by 30 minutes.
 - iii. Mr. Jeffrey was asked by the district to report back on the comments from the SCC. The majority of the council preferred Option One.

The Meeting was adjourned at 9:07 p.m.
